#### **GOAL 5 - Community Schools**

The **Stony Brook and Eddy Elementary Advisory Councils** worked to develop specific ways to implement these goals at each of the schools, as well as who would be responsible for accomplishing them from teachers and staff to parents and the community. Those **School Improvement Plans** were presented and accepted by the Brewster School Committee at meetings earlier in the school year.

### **School Consolidation Update**

The Consolidation Study showed:

- 1. All of our students could not fit into one school without a growth in class sizes
- 2. An addition would have to be built to accommodate the increased number of students housed at Eddy
- 3. Repairs & upgrades would be required at Stony Brook to house all students

Due to our commitment to small class sizes that give every Brewster student the best chance to learn, the Brewster School Committee unanimously passed a motion on October 20, 2022 to table the consolidation idea until enrollment was reduced to allow room for all of our students in a current building.

# **School Consolidation Update**

### Here is the School Committee Motion as passed:

Given that the current student population at the Brewster elementary schools cannot be accommodated in either the Stony Brook or the Eddy School,

I move that the issue of consolidation be tabled at this time.

I further move that consolidation be tabled until the enrollment of incoming classes has declined to the extent that fewer classrooms are required.

### **Enrollment**

# Current Enrollment at Stony Brook Pre-Kindergarten—Grade 2:

September 2023 = 229 Students

March 2024 = 230 Students

**Current Enrollment at Eddy Grades 3—5:** 

September 2023 = 207 Students

March 2024 = 206 Students

<u>Total Current Enrollment for Brewster Elementary Schools = 436 Students</u>

Due to the anticipated expansion of the Pre-Kindergarten enrollment, Stony Brook is adding a fourth Pre-K classroom for school year 2024/25.

# **Stony Brook**


Built 1976, Addition 1989

- The study conducted by Habeeb and Associates several years ago stated that we could fit all of the students into one building.
- Since then, the preschool program has expanded, with a fourth classroom planned for 2024/25.
- Special education services to students have also expanded.
- Both of these program expansions have required additional classroom spaces at Stony Brook. The YMCA Child Care rooms will now be used to meet these needs.


# **Eddy**:

### Built in 1996


- Unable to physically fit the Stony Brook student population, staff & school personnel, and service providers.
- Extensive renovations would be needed to make the physical plant at Eddy absorb the Stony Brook population.
- Minimal FTE cost savings, as the vast majority of the FTE would need to remain intact, as they provide the education programming and services to our students, regardless of being in two buildings or one building.

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# **School Use**

Both Stony Brook and Eddy Elementary Schools have full calendars each month for building usage.

### Stony Brook, February 2024

YMCA—The YMCA uses three rooms for its daily child care program

Nauset Youth Alliance—NYA hosts 65 students after school and uses

the cafeteria, gym, staff room, kitchen, and other areas for enrichment

activities such as gymnastics, karate, cooking, science, etc.

Basketball—Each weekday brings evening basketball to the Stony

Brook gym, including Brewster Rec Basketball, Nauset Youth Basketball,

and Latham Basketball
